

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ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE THROUGH OUR CURRICULUM

At Six Villages we offer a broad, balanced and rewarding learning experience, which gives all students the opportunity to work with engaging and supportive staff to ensure they reach their potential.

All students have the opportunity to study the EBacc programme comprising the core academic subjects of English, Mathematics, History or Geography, the Sciences and a language.

YEARS 7,8 & 9 – KEY STAGE 3

All students study English, Mathematics, Science, French, History, Geography, Philosophy, Religion & Ethics, Music, Drama, Art, Technology, Personal, Social, Health & Emotional Education (PSHE) and Physical Education.

YEARS 10 & 11 – KEY STAGE 4

Our GCSE curriculum consists of the compulsory subjects of English, Maths, Science and PE, as well as at least one Humanities subject and either French or Spanish. Students can then choose from a range of other subjects including Art & Design, Design & Technology, Drama, Food Preparation & Nutrition, Music and Philosophy, Religion & Ethics.

Teachers challenge students to aim high. One parent noted:

Both our children benefited from the academy's very well-organised transition to secondary school and 'hit the ground running' when they started Year 7. Looking back, the momentum has not been lost. They remain highly motivated and enjoy giving their best at all times. Research shows the benefits of studying music and playing an instrument can be substantial; developing students academically, particularly with maths mastery; as well as socially through self-confidence, organisation and team skills.

Every student joining the academy has the opportunity to be loaned an orchestral instrument free of charge, and taught how to play that instrument as part of the music curriculum in Key Stage 3.

Students will also learn the basics of music theory and composition and have a chance to expand their musical appreciation of a wide variety of genres. In addition, we offer individual and group instrumental tuition on a variety of instruments, as well as participation in specialist lunchtime ensembles and performance groups.

There are several opportunities during the year for our students to nurture and showcase their performance skills in music and drama to a supportive and appreciative audience of staff, students and families.

Installations, sculpture and artwork produced by our Art & Design and Design & Technology students is also often on display around the academy as well as exhibited at an end of year event.

When I started at Six Villages, I chose to learn the cello, never having played a string instrument before.

I really enjoyed the curriculum lessons, so I joined the after-school enrichment session to improve my technique even more quickly. The scheme has really inspired me to continue learning the cello.'

DEVELOPING THE WHOLE STUDENT THROUGH ENRICHMENT OPPORTUNITIES

At Six Villages we take a holistic approach to our students' education, allowing them not only to embrace academic knowledge and skills, such as problem-solving and analysis, but grow and develop into well-rounded individuals, with a keen sense of self, identity and purpose and strong moral values.

Through our extensive enrichment programme we offer extended learning through a wide range of after-school activities. All students are encouraged to participate in at least one extra-curricular activity per week – sessions have included activities such as coding, science, photography, chess, public speaking and dance, as well as numerous sports clubs and fixtures.

Experiences

Trips and experiences outside of the classroom make a huge contribution to the acquisition of skills and knowledge and can stimulate a life-long interest in a new topic, contribute greatly to personal development and boost academic achievement.

At Six Villages, our students are given the opportunity to participate in both day and residential trips in the UK and further afield. Examples of such trips include the WW1 Battlefields of France and Belgium, skiing in Italy, sailing on the Isle of Wight, the Festival of Speed at Goodwood, Pallant House Gallery in Chichester, performances and concerts at London's theatres and concert halls, as well as outdoor education experiences and county and national sporting events. Our aim is for all students to have had the opportunity to participate in a trip abroad by the end of Year 11.


Annual day-long conferences have allowed our students to be motivated and inspired by speakers from all walks of life, from Olympic athletes to entrepreneurs and empowered by sessions exploring, for example, the theme of rights and responsibilities through a series of creative responses.

We also offer enhanced learning days with external providers, which are designed to be both entertaining and educational, and emphasise and encourage numeracy and literacy through participation in activities such as the UK Maths Challenge, the Chichester Literature Quiz, World Book Day and the Amazing Book Awards.

The taught curriculum is supported by an impressive range of over 40 lunchtime and after-school enrichment activities which develop students' wider skills in areas such as sports and arts.'

ENCOURAGING STUDENT LEADERSHIP AND EMPOWERING STUDENT VOICE

We strongly encourage leadership and mentoring opportunities for students, which allows them to get to know and work with students from all years.


In a process beginning in Year 10, Head Students are appointed, together with deputies and a team of prefects. As the Student Leadership Team, these students are given the opportunity to influence decision making at the academy, helping to shape the school for the benefit of their fellow students.

Other leadership roles give students recognition. Students are able to put themselves forward for membership of the school council which is overseen by the Student Leadership Team. There are opportunities for students to play to their strengths by volunteering as Library Monitors, Sports Reps, IT Technicians and to take part in the Community Action Space 180° outdoor classroom project.

All of our leadership roles empower students to work creatively in partnership with others to achieve shared goals, as well as provide ongoing training that will prove invaluable for their future development.







PREPARING STUDENTS FOR SUCCESS IN OUR GLOBAL COMMUNITY

FURTHER EDUCATION PARTNERSHIPS

We have strongly established links with local Further Education colleges and sixth forms, who have excellent A-level pass and university acceptance rates. These are of tremendous value to our students, the majority of whom continue to A-levels, BTEC and a range of specialist vocational courses.

We also work closely with local universities who offer us a programme of age appropriate, aspiration and attainment raising activities for our Key Stage 4 students. Recent outcomes of our partnership, for example, with Chichester College have included work experience provision and individual careers interviews for all our Year 10 students.

We host an annual Further Education & Careers event for our students and their families, to introduce them to the progression routes available to them once they leave the academy. Representatives from local providers are on hand to offer advice on an array of post-16 choices - from further education to high-quality apprenticeships.
