They will then apply their knowledge to business scenarios and justify the positive and negative outcomes of their choices.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Entrepreneurs and being entrepreneurial, ● Legal Structures, ● Financial Aims ● Organisational Structures, ● Production Methods ● Customer Service, ● Internal Influences, External Assessment, External Influences, challenges of growth 	<p>Year 11 6 lessons a fortnight</p> <p>Content:</p> <p>Students will learn concepts relating to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● business research ● resources ● recruitment ● funding and finance ● business planning <p>They will then learn to apply this knowledge to business scenarios considering the benefits and the different options available to a business.</p> <p>Assessment will consist of a synoptic project where students apply business principles to a company scenario and an exam where they will define business terms and justify solutions to business problems.</p>	<p>A business qualification can lead to A levels and a degree which can give access into a number of positions such as accounting, legal, finance.</p> <p>However, a knowledge of business can be useful in any employment or for creating a new business.</p> <p>Understanding of the financial commitments when in employments such as taxes and VAT.</p>
