

YEAR 7 MUSIC—'TERM TO LEARN'

Here at Six Villages, we run a unique music programme for our students. All Year 7 students are provided with, and learn how to play the violin during one term of Year 7. This program enables students to focus on the basics of one instrument, learn how to look after this, understand and follow some basic notation, and learn pieces and perform regularly as part of a class group. Students who wish to continue after the initial term are able to continue, as part of a smaller group through enrichment free of charge.

The group of Year 7 students participating in 'term to learn' on the violin in the autumn began by learning how to hold the violin; firstly in rest position and in "banjo" position (where the violin is held like a guitar) and finally full standing position. The group have progressed through several pieces, which has introduced them to the violin's open note names. Initially these pieces were played "pizzicato" (with fingers), before moving on to playing with the violin bow (or "arco").

Students have learned to hold the bow correctly (if you see a Year 7 practising picking up a pencil - that's most likely bow hold practice!) and are building their bow hand strength with window wiper exercises!

Beyond their weekly group lessons, students are able to take their instruments home to access Charanga; an online learning resource, where they are able to practise set homework pieces, play violin-related games and create avatars of themselves with points earned while practising.


