Staff and students can log onto Satchel One using their Microsoft Office 365 password. Parents will be sent a specific code which will allow them to access their own child's Satchel One account. The specific code will be sent out during the first week of September by email.

When should homework be set?

Heads of Department will have autonomy as to when homework is set within their subject areas. The consistency and quality of homework set will be monitored via the Satchel One Reports Function and Departmental Reviews.

How frequently should homework be set?

- In order to be fully prepared for their GCSE exams, we expect all Year 11 students to be spending at least an hour and a half per week, outside of lesson time, on each of their exam subjects. This will total around fourteen hours per week.
- This hour and a half should be spent either on homework or exam practice set by the subject teacher, which should take priority, or on revision of the key knowledge and skills needed for each exam.
- There is no published homework timetable for Year 11. Students should be preparing their own revision and homework timetables, to fit in with other commitments in their lives, and to ensure that they have rest and relaxation built in which suits their way of working.
- On the Flying Start evening on Thursday 10th October, we will be providing more detail for both students and parents about effective revision timetables as well as providing you with a list of the key knowledge and skills for each core subject. In the meantime, students should ensure that they complete work set each week and have gone over their learning from Year 10 to ensure that they are confident with the exam content covered.
- You will receive further information about the Flying Start evening shortly; please keep that evening free if at all possible as we will be sharing key exam information for you and your child.
