Important: Stranger Danger

We have been informed of an incident that occurred in Church Lane at approximately 8.15am yesterday morning. A primary school pupil reported that they were stopped by two men in a small white van and asked to get into the van. The van approached Church Lane from Barnham Road and was travelling towards Eastergate school. Thankfully the pupil was not physically harmed and information about the incident has been passed to Sussex Police. Please talk to your child about 'stranger danger' and walking or cycling to school with a friend where possible. Should you have any information regarding this or any similar incidents, please report them to the academy and police.

Year 10 Virtual Work Experience

This year, Year 10's Careers focus has been on one-to-one action planning and gaining experience of the work place. Almost all students have now had a 1 one 1 careers interview with our Careers Advisor, Mel Ponterosso, and she has emailed action plans for them to work with.

Due to Covid 19 restrictions, we've not been able to offer students a traditional work experience week. We have, however, partnered with OAT Futures and Hello Futures to offer excellent sessions linking to experiences of the workplace and essential working skills. Free School Meal Summer Break Arrangements

FSM eligible families will be entitled to a £15.00 voucher per child per week to cover the six-week school summer holiday period. The academy will purchase the vouchers and eligible families will receive a £30 voucher per eligible child every two weeks over the six-week period. Year 11 students who were eligible at the time of leaving in June will also receive them.

Covid-19 update

We have received the following message from West Sussex County Council:

As the number of positive Covid-19 cases continues to rise across the county it remains important that we all continue to follow the Government guidance and help prevent the spread of the virus. Washing hands, physically distancing, wearing face coverings, letting fresh air in, vaccinations and testing are still relevant in combating coronavirus. You can remind yourself of the current rules and restrictions on the GOV.UK website.

Regular testing can identify Covid-19 where symptoms are not present and help protect yourself and others. Visit www.westsussex.gov.uk/communitytesting to order packs of free rapid lateral flow test kits. Anyone with symptoms should self-isolate immediately and book a free PCR test here or call 119.

Updates to guidance ahead of Step 4 of the roadmap

New guidance has been published by the Department for Education ahead of Step 4, covering both the summer period and the following term, when children will return to school:

Rapid asymptomatic testing in secondary schools – September 2021

Following the announcements on Step 4, secondary schools are asked to test all students at an on-site asymptomatic test site (ATS) on return following the summer holidays. This approach is based on the latest public health advice and will help us break chains of transmission in education settings after the summer holidays when students may have been mixing with lots of people. Students will have two on-site tests, the first being on their first day in school (see dates below).

We are advised that consent obtained from parents and carers for the Spring term 2021 testing <u>remains</u> <u>current</u> and does not need therefore to be re-provided to us. Consent forms will be issued to Year 6 into Year 7 families in due course.

Following the two initial on-site tests, students should also continue twice-weekly testing at home for the remainder of the autumn term. All the education workforce should also continue to test – twice-weekly at home – on return in the autumn term. We will review the continued need for testing, based on public health advice at the end of September.
