West Sussex Term Dates – amendment to published schedule

West Sussex County Council have advised of a change to their previously published schedule of term dates to take account of the additional non-working day for schools allocated by the government to mark the Queen's Jubilee.

The last day of term <u>next</u> academic year will now be 21st July 2022, not 22nd July and our final INSET day will now be 21st July and not 22nd July. Therefore, for students the last day of the summer term 2022 will be <u>Wednesday 20th July 2022</u>. The amended table of term dates is below.

Rapid asymptomatic testing in secondary schools – September 2021

A reminder that upon return to school in September, the government has advised that all students should undertake 2 lateral flow Covid 19 tests. All students will be offered these two tests unless you have let us know otherwise. This means that if you provided consent for the March 2021 programme of testing, the consent carries over. If you declined consent, this is noted and you do not need to take any action. If you previously declined consent and now wish to reverse that, please get in touch.

As mentioned in last week's letter, to accommodate the testing programme, there will be a staggered return to school as follows:

Tuesday 7 th September	Year 7, 10 & 11
Wednesday 8 th September	Year 7, 9, 10 & 11
Thursday 9 th September	All year groups

Thank you in advance for helping us bring your children safely back to school in September. If you have any queries regarding the lateral flow testing, please contact Mrs Canadas on <u>ccs@ormistonsixvillages.org.uk</u>. As outlined previously, the consent form will be issued to Year 6 families over the summer.

<u>Home test kits</u>: Whilst we have taken delivery of the testing kits for September's testing programme, we have not received any further home kits.
