

TRANSITION DAY Tuesday 4th July 2023

Please arrive at OSVA at 8:10am.

You should wear your primary school uniform. In your school bag you should bring a bag, your pencil case, a snack for breaktime, your lunch and a drink of water.

Register at the desks outside. They will be labelled 70, 7R, 7M, 7S or 7T.

Register at the desk with your tutor group name on it. (Don't worry if you can't remember your tutor groupwe will help you.)

You will go into the Gate Theatre with your form group and your tutor. Mr Slaughter (our Principal), Ms Barber (Assistant Principal: SENCO) and Mrs McHale (Director of Learning, Year 7) will welcome you.

Your first lesson you will spend with your form tutor getting to know them and the other students in your tutor group. You will then spend the rest of the day in different lessons meeting some of your new teachers.


EQUIPMENT


























There are other people who can help you around the Academy if you have problems.

Mrs Molineaux Inglis is OSVA's emotional Wellbeing Lead who runs the Emotional Wellbeing Ambassadors. They can help if you are struggling with your emotions and mental health. You can find them as they are wearing a yellow 'Wellbeing Ambassador' badge.



WOODY

Woody is our academy therapy dog. He can be found in Inclusion and sometimes goes to lessons.

THE STUDENT LEADERSHIP TEAM

TUTOR TIME AND ROLL CALL

Every morning you will take part in the Academy Roll Call

This involves you lining up alphabetically in your tutor group, with your equipment out ready for your tutor to check and take the register.

Roll call starts at 8.20, so you need to be in your line before the bell rings at 8.17.

Roll call takes place in silence.

Once your tutor has taken the register you will head back to your tutor base.

During tutor time, you will be able to speak with you tutor about any concerns that you have, you will also as a form discuss attendance and rewards.

Your tutor group will also be given a book, which you will read together during tutor time.

ENRICHMENT:


Lunchtime and after-school clubs



YOUR JOURNEY TO SCHOOL

HOMEWORK LEARNING PLATFORM



During your first week at Ormiston Six Villages you will be given an Academy email address and login details to our online homework platform Satchel: One.

Teachers will set you homework, add reward points and any negative behaviour points you might receive. Your parents will also have a login, so will be able to see all of your points and the homework you are set.



Sparx Maths will support you and your parents/carers with personalised maths homework online.

If you do not have a computer or laptop at home, please let your form tutor know as soon as possible.




In September download Satchel: One to your phone. Complete your homework the night it is set, that way if you get stuck you have time to ask your teacher for help.

MOBILE PHONES
