Please find this week's notices below:

Buses

I am aware of and dealing with instances of poor behaviour and damage on the buses. I will not allow the behaviour of a very small minority to jeopardise the service provided to us. CCTV is requested on each occasion and those involved will be identified and sanctioned. Such behaviour does not occur at school, and I'm sure doesn't occur at home, and consequently we do not expect it to happen between home and school.

If your child, at any time, sees any such behaviour, we ask for them to report it to us in complete confidence.

Attendance

Congratulations to the very high number of students who have achieved 100% attendance this half term. Attendance continues to be a national and academy priority and parents and carers of students whose attendance and punctuality are falling below expected levels will continue to hear from us about this.

Lateness to school

Students are encouraged to arrive at school in plenty of time and should be ready for roll call in their allocated year group area when the bell rings. Students arriving late are sanctioned with a detention. Regular lateness will result in an unauthorised absence code being applied to their student record. Arriving late at school can be very disruptive for the child, their teacher and the other children in their class.

Interesting facts about attendance and punctuality

- If your child is 5 minutes late each day, they will miss three days of learning each year
- If your child is 15 minutes late every day, they will miss 2 weeks of learning each year
- Attendance at 90% is equivalent to missing 4 weeks of learning each year
- Attendance at 80% is equivalent to missing more than half a term per year
- An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career equates to missing at least a whole year of lessons
- On average, students who attend less than 96% through their school career drop one grade in each of their qualifications in Year 11

I feel compelled to remind you also that holidays during term time are unlawful and will not be authorised. Please note also the requirement to contact the academy on 01243 546854 every day that your child is absent from school, to avoid accruing unauthorised absences, which may lead to action being taken.

Developing good attendance and punctuality habits now will help our students in the workplace later.

Year 7 Maths Sets

After half term year 7 maths classes will be changing so that all students are in the best class for their ability. All students cover the same topics but it means that the pace of work will be better suited to them. We have used KS2 data, GL assessments and in class observations to inform these set changes. Year 11 mock exams

Year 11 mock exams will run for two weeks from 6th November and students have been issued their exam timetable this week. Students need to be fully equipped for the exams, with a see-through pencil case, pens, pencils, calculator and maths equipment. They may take a bottle of water into the exam, this must be in a clear bottle with no label on it.

Whilst there are lots of opportunities for additional preparation in school, it is also vital that every student makes effective use of their time at home. This is never truer than during the half term, Christmas and Easter holidays. Your child's teacher will have ensured that they have access to all of the subject resources which are needed to support their revision. We would urge all parents and carers to consider the following for their children over the next few weeks:

- Do they have a quiet place to study, with no distractions?
- Do they have a device such as a laptop, PC or Chromebook on which to work?
- Are they in a good sleep routine?
- Are they eating well and drinking plenty of water?
- Are they taking time out to exercise in the fresh air? Are they spending quality time with friends and family to recharge their batteries?
- Do they have a clear plan of which subjects to revise each day, ideally in short burst with gaps for fresh air and exercise?

Uniform Expectations

A school holiday is always a good time to take a moment to check your child's uniform and equipment. If you are in any doubt about what is and isn't allowed, this information can be found on the website Ormiston Six Villages Academy - Uniform.

I would like to highlight that false nails, acrylics or coloured varnish, false eye lashes and piercings other than one ear -ring in each ear lobe are not permitted and students will be removed from their lesson until these issues are rectified. Your support with this is requested, please. It's worth noting that there are not any schools in this locality which permit facial piercings other than ears. Please note also that make up in Year 7 and 8 is not permitted.

With inclement weather approaching more and more, please ensure your child wears a suitable outer layer to school over their blazer. Hoodies and non-school jumpers are not permitted and will be confiscated.

I am delighted to share that the works on our MUGA have finished and we have a beautiful surface for PE lessons and break/lunch time sport to take place on.


Please take a moment to look at the poster opposite to note the footwear that is allowed on the MUGA.

The Immunisation Service are coming into school on **15th November 2023** to offer your child the Flu vaccination. Attached to this email are the following documents:

A parent/carer letter – containing vaccination information and instructions on how to complete the online
consent form. Please complete a form to either consent to or refuse your child receiving this vaccination.
The online consent form is available for completion until 11am four working days before the session date
above.


If you have more than one child in the same year group, but they do not attend the same school site, you will receive a separate letter from each school site, to consent for each child, prior to their school's vaccination session. Please use the correct school code for each child.

If you have any difficulties completing the online consent form, please contact your local Immunisation Team before the cut-off date, using the telephone number provided in the attached letter, or, ask your school to notify the Immunisation Team so that we can contact you directly. If you miss the cut off time to complete the consent form, we will not be able to vaccinate your child in school on the day of the vaccination session. The consent form will reopen one working day after the session, enabling you to submit a form for your child to be offered the vaccination, within one of their catch-up clinics.


What parents and carers need to know about EA Sports 2024

This week's national online security focus is EA Sports 2024. This is a very similar proposition to last year's FIFA 23. Popular features such as Ultimate Team remain a big focus, meaning that potentially costly in-game spending is still among the line-up of risks that parents and carers should know about.

The poster below summaries the many risks:

- Recurring releases
- Offensive voice chat
- In-game purchases
- Ultimate team scammers
- Potential for addiction

I would urge you to follow the advice for parents and carers in the poster at the end of this letter.



- Defend against scammers
- Use the companion mobile app to identify if your child is playing EA Sports FC too much
- Listen on the voice chat occasionally for any warning signs that things are becoming too competitive and ultimately toxic
