What children and young people need to know about Smartphone Safety

This week's National Online Safety bulletin advises us that according to Ofcom, 69% of under-18s use a smartphone as their main method of going online. Additionally, 49% of children use them for online gaming – putting smartphones only behind consoles (59%) as the device of choice for playing games on. Most people won't require such statistical evidence, however, to acknowledge the huge importance of phones to young people.

Given that Santa's recent visit is likely to have bestowed smartphones on an even greater number of young people, it's a particularly opportune moment to ensure that children are able to use their handsets responsibly – and, above all, safely. From passcodes to parental controls, and from screen time to scams, you are advised to consider the following:

- Let your child know they should never share their password or passcode
- Check they are only using age-appropriate apps
- Remove the temptation to use their phones during the night by removing them from your children before bedtime
- To talk to a trusted adult if they have concerns about anything they see or do or any messages they receive on their phones
- To stay alert, people often walk with their heads down looking at their phones and can forget to check for obstacles around them.
- Set limits on the amount of screen time allowed in a day.
- Switch off geolocation so people they are interacting with can't see where they live
