After the rounds had commenced, we had results and rewards corresponding to performance throughout the event. Overall, one team which consisted of Ellie, Jack, Will and Jacob won the best calculations award for a specific question in round one that was extremely difficult to work out! The other team consisting of Hannah, Isobel, Erin and Lola won the whole of the final round which was made up of constructing objects out of folding paper!
