**Dear Parents and Carers**

During August, we were thrilled to celebrate the exam successes of the Class of 2024. They certainly did us proud! Onto this year, we will be trialling a new format for parents' consultations by offering a blended event. It is my hope that the online event will be convenient to those of you whose work commitments make it difficult to come to school and that those of you who prefer a face to face consultation will be equally catered for. # Open Evening – Tuesday 24th September – early finish

As usual, students will finish school at the end of period 4 on this day. This means that they finish at **1.10pm**. The bus companies have confirmed that they will come to school to collect students at 1.10pm. This does not apply to the public bus, only our school buses. The usual 2.50pm buses will not run on this day. If your child usually gets the public bus, please make arrangements for your child to get home or check the bus timetable for alternative times the bus passes through Westergate.

As with last year, the early finish allows staff time to set up classrooms ready for the start of open evening at 5pm and will give students a break and time to eat prior to returning to school to help at **4.30pm**. Our students play an important part at open evening, taking on the role of tour guides taking families around the academy or helping in departments.
