#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

I am writing to you at the end of a very successful academic year and as the term draws to a close I would like to begin by thanking you for the continued support you have given us over the course of the year. # **Uniform**

I realise that some students exert pressure on their parents to purchase items which are unacceptable instead of our stated uniform. Please refer to our uniform expectations prior to replacing school uniform. Ormiston Six Villages Academy - Uniform. We will be returning to full, smart academy uniform on 5<sup>th</sup> September, with blazer and tie. It is highly unlikely that jumpers will be needed at the start of September and they may not be worn in place of the blazer.

#### Jewellery, hair colour and piercings

Please be reminded of our expectations regarding hair colour and piercings. If your child will be having a piercing done over the summer other than one ear-ring stud in each year, please ensure that it is healed by the start of the new term as nose and tongue piercings are not permitted in school and will have to be removed. Similarly, acrylic nails and nail varnish will also need to be removed by 5<sup>th</sup> September. Rings, bracelets and necklaces are not permitted either. We are very proud of our smart uniform and thank you for your helping maintain our high standards.

## **Equipment**

Please give your child a good start to 2025-26 by ensuring they have the following compulsory equipment: a pencil case; 2 black or blue ball point pens; a green pen; 2 HB pencils; an eraser, a pencil sharpener, a pair of compasses; a protractor; a 30 cm ruler; a black whiteboard pen and a whiteboard rubber. Students need a scientific calculator and a reading book of their choice. Students need a school bag.

## **School Photos and Annual Photography and Video Consent**

The annual visit by the school photographer, Yellow, to take photos of Year 7, 9 and 11 students will take place on 10<sup>th</sup> September. Your help is urgently needed please. We are required to obtain photography and video consent annually from parents and carers. If we do not have consent from you, we will not be able to allow Yellow to take your child's school photo. Currently, only approximately 25 children in each year group will be allowed to have their photo taken. If you do not wish to provide consent, we still need you to complete the form to that effect.

## Open Evening – Thursday 18th September

A reminder of last week's advance notice of our Open Evening, which will take place on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> September. As usual, students will finish school at **1.10pm** on this day. The bus companies have confirmed that they will come to school to collect students at 1.10pm. This does not apply to the public bus, only our school buses. The usual 2.50pm buses will not run on this day. If your child usually gets the public bus, please make arrangements for your child to get home or check the bus timetable for alternative times the bus passes through Westergate, eg 500 bus which runs every 30 minutes between Chichester and Littlehampton. The early finish allows staff time to set up classrooms and activities around site ready for the start of open evening and will give students a break and time to eat prior to returning to school to help at 5.30pm.

We are always very keen to involve as many student helpers as possible, hence the early notice of this. Our students play an important part at open evening, taking on the role of tour guides taking families around the academy or helping in departments. We are always delighted to have so many of our students helping at this event and would like to thank you for supporting this annual event.
